Auditions for Music Ensembles

♦ Furman Bands

Open to all woodwind, brass, and percussion musicians as well as dancers, twirlers, and colorgaurd, the Furman University Bands are comprised of students from across campus who come together to perform as the Paladin Regiment Marching Band and the Furman Symphonic Band. In the fall semester, the marching band rehearses only 4 hours a week -- on Wednesdays and Fridays from 4-6 p.m. -- and performs for the home football hgames and select exhibition and parade performances. The Symphonic Band rehearses on Mondays from 4-6 p.m. in the fall semester and on Mondays and Wednesdays from 4-6 p.m.

When asked what makes studying music at Furman appealing and satisfying, our students talk about the many opportunities they have to perform. Students choose from large ensembles like the Symphony Orchestra, the Symphonic Band, the Furman Singers, and the Marching Band, as well as smaller groups like the Percussion Ensemble, the Jazz Ensembles, the treble choir Belle Voci, and the String Quartets. Talented vocalists participate in fullscale productions of the Sarah Reese Lyric Theatre. Dedicated performers may be honored by selection to the biannual Honors Recital. Twice yearly, the choral organizations combine with the orchestra to present choral-orchestral concerts of works from the oratorio repertoire. Talented instrumentalists compete for solo performances with the orchestra in our Concerto Competition. Rarely does a small liberal-arts college offer the range of performing opportunities available at Furman. You can choose from among more than 20 different student ensembles. All performing groups are open to all Furman students, regardless of major.

Horn auditions will occur between 6:30-9 p.m. on Wednesday, August 28, and between 2:30-3:45 p.m. on Thursday, August 29. The Furman Jazz Ensemble will rehearse each Monday and Thursday from 2:30-3:45 p.m. beginning Thursday, September 5. The Furman Jazz Combos will rehearse twice each week for 60 minutes, once with a faculty coach. Times will be determined once the ensembles are formed. Auditions for NEW string students who have not previously been approved for study and who are interested in applied lessons, chamber music, and/or the Furman Symphony Orchestra (FSO) will take place Tuesday, August 27 from 3:30-4 p.m. in DMB-013. String seating auditions for ALL students previously approved for study (both incoming and returning students) will take place Tuesday, August 27 from 4-9 p.m. in the Daniel Recital Hall; violins from 4-6 p.m., violas from 7-7:30 p.m., cellos from 7:30-8:30 p.m., and basses from 8:30-9 p.m. Students will prepare a short solo of their choice (up to 2 minutes), a short sight-reading selection, and short orchestral excerpts, which will be available by July 15. Wind, percussion, and brass assignments are given to the FSO conductor by the wind/percussion/brass faculty and will be posted in the first week of classes. The first FSO rehearsal is Thursday, August 29. FSO meets twice a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4-6 p.m. For more information, contact Professor Stephan Fillare at stephan.fillare@furman.edu.

Auditions for Private Lesson Placement

All students with prior instrumental or vocal experience can be considered for private instruction. Private lessons are given at variable credit (0-2) and students sign up for 30-minute or 60-minute lessons per week. If a student who is not majoring in music signs up for 1-credit lessons in 4 consecutive semesters, that fulfills the Visual and Performing Arts general education requirement.







Music Theory at Furman

Music Theory study (which we call Basic Musicianship) consists of four semesters of written theory, aural skills, and keyboard harmony. Intended music majors are pre-registered for the 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m., or 11:30 a.m. section of Basic Musicianship I, which Meets Monday - Friday.

MUS 111 satisfies the Visual and Performing Arts GER (VP).

AP Theory Credit

Furman University now <u>accepts</u> AP credit for music theory. Furman accepts credit for MUS 111A and MUS 111B for students who scored a 5 on the AP exam. Furman offers students who scores a 5 on the AP exam the choide to audit MUS 111A and MUS 111B. Furman highly recommends that students who scored a 5 on the AP exam in their junior year or earlier to enroll in MUS 111A and MUS 111B.

Furman accepts no other form of credit (other than transfer credit as governed by university policy for equivalent courses). Furman no longer does internal testing. Furman no longer allows students to test out of half of MUS 111A (formerly known as attendance optional).

Students who have not scored a 5 on the AP exam, but who have considerable experience in music theory, should explore Furman's Credit By Exam policy.

The Keyboard Area faculty will administer a placement exam for keyboard harmony during the first week of classes. Contact Dr. Derek Parsons (derek.parsons@furman.edu) with questions about keyboard harmony placement.
